A Side Note on *Essayer* and Essays

- The word essay comes from the French essayer (to try, attempt, or struggle).
- Writing an essay is both an attempt in convincing someone and attempt as in a task, you as the writer, must do.

Steps to Analytical Reading – Page 183

- 1. Study the title.
- 2. Note any publication information.
 - 1. Is the author qualified?
 - 2. Where and when was this published?
- 3. First read through and annotations.
 - 1. What were your first impressions?
- 4. Look at the title again and first paragraphs! Does the title set you up well?
- 5. Locate the thesis!

Steps to Analytical Reading – Page 183

6. Re-read the essay while looking for topic sentences?

7. What ideas are supporting the topic sentences? (Look for how ideas compare and contrast, show a cause-and-effect method, or a combination of methods).

- 8. What is the essay's organization?
- 9. Does the essay flow logically and clearly?
- 10. Consider style and tone.
